

# Cornus Mas *(Cornelian Cherry)*

- The Cornelian Cherry was introduced in England in the late 1890's, as it is native to central and southern Europe.
- The tree produces small yellow flowers in February, making it one of the earliest trees to blossom.
- It produces bright red, cherry-like fruits which are edible.
- Its leaves turn reddish purple in autumn.
- It can grow in most soil conditions.
- It has interesting bark and is good for bees.



Height when mature: **3 – 7 metres**

Time takes to grow: **10 to 20 years**

Flower colour: **Yellow**
